### The Genesee Diary Report from a Trappist Monastery, by Henri Nouwen

Henri J.M. Nouwen was a Catholic priest and renown spiritual writer who taught at several theological institutes and universities in his home country of the Netherlands and in the United States. During the 1970s, Nouwen lived and worked with the Trappist monks in the Abbey of the Genesee, and in the early 1980s he lived with the poor in Peru. He died in 1996.

This book is the diary he kept at Genesee during a sabbatical from teaching. It is a beautifully written account of his exploration of the typical human experiences which manage to displace Christ from the center of our lives. He is honest, compassionate and humorous. Many are the marked up copies of this book in home libraries. This book is chock full of comments, reflections and confessions that can serve as fodder for the meditations of all spiritual seekers. (Available at a variety of online booksellers.)
