Financial Update

The following statement reflects our financial results for the nine months ended March 31, 2013. The Operating category reflects revenue and expenses for normal recurring operations. The Capital category reflects revenue and expenses for non-recurring capital maintenance needs and consists of funds raised for the Elevator campaign. The excess revenues over expenses for operating of \$153,280 is expected to be depleted to a certain extent in the last 3 months of our fiscal year, which generally is not as strong financially as the rest of the year. The excess of revenue over expenses for capital is due to timing, as the expenditures for the elevator construction is expected to commence this summer.

Sacramental Photos

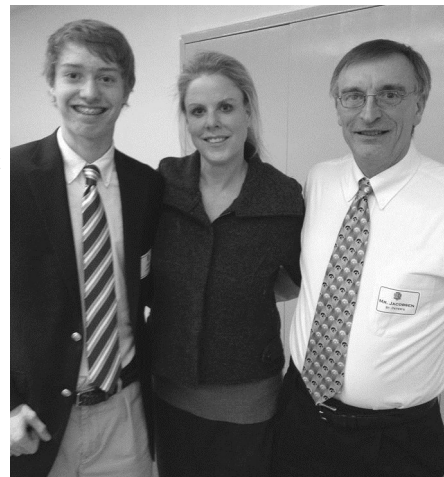

The St. Peter's School PTA is hosting a Book Fair this week. Come down after Masses this Sunday, April 2, and browse through the books. The fair will be open as follows:

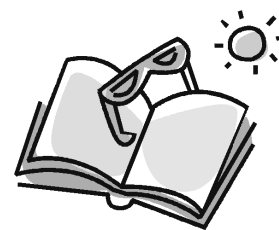
