Campus Master Plan

Campus Master Plan Update #5: North School Building

The Campus Master Plan Committee (CMPC) began the buildings review with a tour of all our facilities on the St Peter's campus. The Parish Business Manager and Maintenance Director, Tom Nickel, also provided us with a list of all the current maintenance and deferred maintenance items for all buildings. It quickly became apparent the School needed much attention. The priorities on Tom's list included a new elevator for accessibility, a new boiler, air conditioning, new lighting, new back bone wiring and wiring for WIFI, just to name a few. Janet Spallo, SPS Principal, indicated the need for one additional classroom, an expanded music room, an expanded special education resource room and more usable space. The CMPC quickly began to generate renovation concepts for all the campus buildings, incorporating these priorities. Rough sketches were made, conceptual cost estimates were obtained from qualified general contractors and all of this data was reviewed and analyzed by the CMPC and Fr. Steve.

As mentioned, the building in need of the most obvious attention is our original stone facing Meyer Boulevard, which was built in 1928.. This beautiful old structure originally housed the church, and that space was later converted to a gym. Since that time, two additional renovations were undertaken, to accommodate our growing school. Classrooms were added on the south side of this original building and when the McKay Center was built, the old gym was renovated to create additional classrooms.

As with any building which undergoes dramatic additions and renovations over time, there are challenges that are created, both aesthetic and logistically. So the CMPC looked at very invasive renovations of the north school building, such as raising floors to eliminate many of the partial floor stairs, new stairs to improve circulation, and a new physical plant to replace the very outdated heating, cooling, plumbing and wiring in the building. This aggressive renovation approach proved to be very costly, so the decision was made to focus the design direction on the physical plant improvements and the academic needs.

We compared these potential renovations to a build-out of the basement of the McKay Center both from a functional perspective and a financial perspective. The analysis continued to point to renovating the north school building and leaving the basement of the McKay Center available for other uses such as storage, entire school student body storm shelter, and event space for the SPS Auction and Wurst Fest.

With a clear goal of renovating the north school building to improve the academic needs and the physical plant of the school, the following needs and benefits were identified.

Needs:

1. Academic and Administrative Environment

- Add one classroom
- Expand Art and Music Rooms
- Improve space for special needs programs (FIRE) - Resource Room
- Create Parent/Teacher Conference Space
- Improve/expand Administration offices

2. Physical Plant

- Create better physical environment, making the facility:
 - Cooler in warm weather
 - Warmer in cold weather
 - More energy efficient
 - Wired for technology
 - Meet city ordinances on electrical wiring and fire sprinkler systems
 - Include renovated restrooms and plumbing

Campus Master Plan (continued):

Design Solution - North School Building

Our recommended design solutions will meet all the academic and administration goals and the physical plant improvement goals, to prolong the life of the building another 30 years with only general maintenance required. Specifically, the renovations are:

- New floor plan to accommodate the Academic and Administration needs
- New high efficiency hot water boilers to replace the old, using 1/3 of the space.
- New central air conditioning in each perimeter classroom via variable refrigerant condensing air conditioning units (ductless)
- New main electrical service for entire St Peter's campus and primary distribution to surrounding buildings, including the church
- New branch wiring in the north school building
- New lay in ceilings and new florescent lighting throughout, with ceiling fans in each class room
- New windows on the south courtyard facade
- WiFi capability
- New fire sprinklers and life safety systems (fire alarm, etc.)
- All new restrooms on each level.
- New carpet and painting throughout
- Budget for new school equipment and furniture

Cost and Schedule

The CMPC worked closely with experts in the industry to estimate and confirm physical plant systems. A.L. Huber provided all the cost estimating. Parishioner Jerry Bauers consulted on the school mechanical systems and worked closely with parishioner Mark Oxler, with US Engineering. Heartland Electric provided valuable input on all electrical scope items since they have done a majority of the electrical work on the campus. With this expertise, the CMPC has a high degree of confidence that a renovated north school building can be delivered in an "extended" summer construction period from approximately May 1 through Labor Day, during the year designated for the completion of the work. SPS would need to modify the academic calendar to accommodate this, but all individuals were positive that this could be accomplished. Likewise the CMPC has a high degree of confidence that this project, including design and engineering fees, can be delivered in the range of a total cost of \$4M. While this is costly, the improvements are tremendous and will sustain our school ministry for the foreseeable future. We hope the parish shares in our enthusiasm that this project, as presented would make a lasting impact on the St Peter's campus.
